Labor Law Corner

Equipment Failure Not Usually Cause to Permit Partial Pay of Employees

If we send employees home early because of equipment failure, must we pay them for the entire shift? They were sent home about one hour early.

The provisions of the Industrial Welfare Commission (IWC) reporting time pay provisions are designed to compensate employees for at least a portion of the time they make themselves available to the employer.

The requirement is that on each day the employee reports for work and is not put to work or is furnished less than half of his/her usual or scheduled day's work, he/she should be paid for half of his/her usual or scheduled day's work at no less than two hours and no more than four hours.

Because four hours is the maximum pay required by the reporting time requirements, where an employee has worked more than four hours before the work stoppage, absent the requirement of a second reporting, the provisions of the section would no longer apply.

Were it a matter of employees reporting for work and being sent home because of equipment failure, you would look at the reporting time pay provisions of the IWC Orders.

Outside Employer's Control

The language of subdivision 5(c)(3) of the IWC Orders provides an exemption to the section's reporting time pay requirements if the interruption of work is caused by an act of God or other cause not within the employer's control.

Obviously, a loss of power may or may not be an act of God as that term is usually used. The question then becomes what is meant by "other cause not within the employer's control."

The term "act of God" is defined by *Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary* as "An inevitable accident. Such an interruption of the usual course of events that no experience, foresight or care which might reasonably be expected could have foreseen or guarded against it."

The IWC did not intend to require a determination if the interruption was "reasonably" within the employer's control, for it could easily have said so. It must therefore be concluded that what was intended was that the interruption was not even remotely within the employer's control. An equipment failure is obviously subject to someone's control, and the employer would appear to be the obvious choice.

Reporting Time Pay

It should be noted that reporting time pay is not required when "the interruption of work [requiring the second reporting time] is caused by an act of God or other cause not within the employer's control."

The Division of Labor Standards Enforcement has recently concluded that rain or other inclement weather which makes it impossible or unsafe to work falls into the category of "an act of God or other cause not within the employer's control."

This means that if workers are sent home (either immediately upon reporting to work or during the workday) because of rain or other inclement weather, there is no obligation to pay reporting time pay.

WHAT IS SLO COUNTY LAFCO?

SLO County LAFCO has the following mission statement:

"The Local Agency Formation Commission, LAFCO, is committed to serving the local residents of San Luis Obispo County and the State of California by discouraging urban sprawl and encouraging the orderly formation and development of local agencies based on local conditions and circumstances."

Their authority is codified in the CKH Act of 2000 of the California Government Code. Their charge is to "review and approve or disapprove proposals for boundary changes or governmental reorganizations of cities and special district, including (1) the formation of special districts and cities, and (2) the annexation and detachment of territory to cities and special districts. In addition, LAFCO is also required to determine a 'sphere of influence' for each local governmental agency within the county. A sphere of influence (SOI) is a plan for the probable physical boundaries and service area of the agency..."

SLO LAFCO guidelines continue, "In reviewing proposals, LAFCO is required to consider certain factors such as the conformity between city and county plans, current levels and needs for future services to the area, and the social, physical and economic effects that agency boundary changes may present to the community."

The Commission has seven appointed members (two city, two county, two special district and one public rep), and four alternate members (one city, one county, one special district and one public). Currently, LAFCO members from our area are W Scalise (Mayor of Atascadero) and D Picanco (City Councilman, Paso Robles). All other members are from North Coast, and primarily South County. The special districts (of which Templeton is one) are currently represented by members from Oceano CSD, Los Osos CSD and the Port San Luis Harbor District. However, a member from the Templeton CSD was recently elected as a Commissioner. Dave Brooks will begin to serve his appointment as a Special District rep to LAFCO in Jan 2006. His experience and knowledge of concerns specific to our area will help to better represent our community, and all of North County.

Why is all of this of concern to us? In essence, our boundary lines, as well as those of our neighbors to the immediate north and south, are determined by the Commission. As a Chamber of Commerce, and citizens of Templeton, our concern is the effect a change in boundary lines has on our community. We cannot afford the loss of prime commercial property to other jurisdictions, as we did along the freeway corridor down Theatre Drive. And more recently, as we did at the four corners of the Hwy 101/ 46W intersection, and along Ramada south to the CDF station. Continued loss of such prime properties (and the revenue they generate) threaten our ability to remain an independent, economically viable community. Thus, we feel it is important that we stay informed and aware of proposed changes to our boundary lines as LAFCO makes their decision.

Of great interest to our community at this time, is a proposed boundary line change to Templeton's sphere of influence. LAFCO is studying a proposal to increase our SOI to include four areas adjacent to our current Urban Reserve Line (URL). Of primary economic interest to Templeton is a large area just east of Theatre Drive that runs north to Hwy 46 W. Adding this area to our SOI would help secure our northern boundaries. However, not so surprisingly, our ever active neighbor to the north has also ex-
